## THE JANE FREEMANTLE FELLOWSHIP

The Jane Freemantle Fellowship provides full board and accommodation at Ormond College, the University of Melbourne, for up to three months whilst a postgraduate student is completing her/his doctoral thesis. The Fellowship enables the student to work on their thesis uninterrupted, nurtured in an environment that fosters and encourages academic excellence. Associate Professor Jane Freemantle and her family have established the endowment to provide postgraduate students with an opportunity for academic and personal growth, and to offer support at a time of particular academic intensity. The timing of the Fellowship will be at a mutually convenient period when appropriate accommodation is available at Ormond College. Children are not ordinarily able to be accommodated at the College.

The Fellowship will be awarded to a postgraduate student who:

- requires a quiet reflective place to prepare their doctoral thesis for submission
- has work or family commitments such that a three month study period would be a critical success factor in completing their thesis
- would contribute meaningfully to the Ormond community during their period of residency
- demonstrates financial need

Preference will be given to a student working in the medical/community/social research/Indigenous health spheres.
