Am I eligible?

Financial assistance is offered solely on the basis of individual financial need to students from households with a combined taxable income below AUD\$250,000.

I'm not sure if I'll qualify.

We award assistance on a case-by-case basis. So, if you wish to join the Ormond College community and need some help to get you there, we strongly encourage you to apply for financial assistance.

How do I apply?

Download and complete the application form on our website and return it to us. You must have submitted an application for residency before submitting an application for financial assistance.

Can any uni student live at Ormond?

All students in our community must be enrolled into The University of Melbourne or its affiliates (Victorian College of the Arts, Melbourne Business School or the Australian National Academy of Music).

Budgeting

In your application we ask for estimates of your income and expenses so it's a good idea to start thinking about: Will I qualify for Centrelink payments? What is my family's financial situation? Do I need to get a part-time job?
